Weekly Recipe: **Italian Vegetable Stew**

Ingredients:

6 Tbsp Olive oil	1 1/4lb eggplant, unpeeled, cut into 1/2 in cubes
1 large onion chopped	1 large potato 2 cans peeled tomatoes
2 medium zucchini	2 large sweet red peppers, chopped
2Tbsp tomato paste	2 1/4 c. water

Preparation:

Sauté potato, onion and eggplant. Add tomato paste, canned whole tomatoes and 2-1/4 cups water. Let it cook for 20 minutes. Cook zucchini and re peppers in a separate pan. When brown add to potato mixture. Finish with fresh basil




SWEET POTATO DIG!
